SATURDAY 20 MAY

Cars assemble at the KING EDWARD ST STREET PARTY, at 9.00am, first Classic car leaves the formal start over the start ramp at 9.30 am.

Special Stage 1
25.1km **Otago Finance McLaren Gully Rd.** First Classic starts 10.05am
Best viewing from any of the intersecting roads.

Special Stage 2
8.2km **Valley Industries McIntosh Rd** 10.50am
Best viewing from intersection mid stage. Access via Law Rd or Brighton - Scroggs Hill Rd.

“Pitstop” Service Park 1 at Waihola. First car arrives at 11.15am and stays 20 minutes. Note this service park is a feature, with cars visiting it three times.

Special Stage 3
10.0km **O’Neill Devereux Taieri Beach** 11.50am
Best viewing from, start and finish off Waihola Taieri Beach Rd.

Special Stage 4
26.8km **Castle St Panel Beaters Akatore 1** 12.15pm
Best viewing at start and finish. Mid stage access from Akatore will be blocked

“Pitstop” Service Park 2 at Waihola. First car arrives at 12.50pm and stays 30 minutes

Special Stage 5
12.6km **Gilmour Motors Prentice Rd 1** 1.45pm
Best viewing from start and especially the finish (a bit of a walk).

Special Stage 6
22.3km **McCombe and Co Fort Hill** 2.05pm
Best viewing from any of the intersecting roads or the start and finish.

“Pitstop” Service Park 3 at Waihola. First car arrives at 2.35pm and stays 20 minutes.

Special Stage 7
11.5km **Mitchell Mackersy Whare Flat** 3.35pm
Best viewing from the Pineapple track carpark, start and finish.

After stage 7 the cars proceed to Service Park 4 at Timaru St for 1 hour. First car arrives 4.15pm.

The road is only open after a special stage when the tail car goes by after the MAIN FIELD. The Tail Car is clearly marked. Until it arrives expect a rally car at any time, even if there’s been a long break.

THE SHORELINE CLASSIC RALLY

The Classic Rally is for pre 1982 two wheel drive vehicles. Entries include Alan Dippie’s MGB, Garry Adcock’s TR7V8, Gary Cliff’s Nissan 240RS and Brent Rawston’s BDA Escort.

The Classic rally is a lot of fun and drivers enjoy competing in a vehicle they particularly like, not being concerned on whether it is the latest model. There are more relaxed rules. Servicing is allowed anywhere, and competitors can miss a stage and join in again later.

The Classic Rally is run as a separate group, before the main rally, and in reverse seeded order, slowest to fastest. There will only be a very short gap between the Classics and the following field. Expect the first National Championship car immediately after the last classic.

THE DO’S AND DON’TS

Rallying is a spectacular sport to watch and we hope that you will come out and follow it. There are a few safety rules that you must observe as there is no guarantee that the cars you are watching are under control!!

- Don’t assume that you can hear a car coming
- Don’t stand on the outside of a corner
- Do stand where you can make a hasty escape or are safe from a car crashing
- Don’t assume that the rally cars will arrive at even intervals
- Do please leave your dog at home

Best viewing at start and finish. SS4 in reverse.

Wharf area, beside old Anzac Ave overbridge. Main field follows the classics in reverse order. Best viewing from the overbridge or any intersection. Fast and spectacular!!! Four laps of a block sideways.

Immediately after stage 14 a prizegiving ceremony will be held at stage 14 in front of the overbridge.
